Instructions: Twenty-four of the lights (i.e., the answers as they are to be entered in the diagram) are in the form of the title, which is one way in which the answer "babe in the woods" might appear. Similarly, the answer "reverse English" would lead to the light HSILGNE. In each case, the connecting word (or words) of the answer indicates what should be done to it before entering it in the diagram and, as in the above examples, the connecting words themselves are omitted in the light.

The number in parentheses after a clue indicates the total number of letters in the *light*; the number of words in the answer to the clue is not revealed. Ignore punctuation, which is designed to confuse.
